Remember, you must **register** for free access to Graded Readers e-books. Don't worry it's easy and it's free:

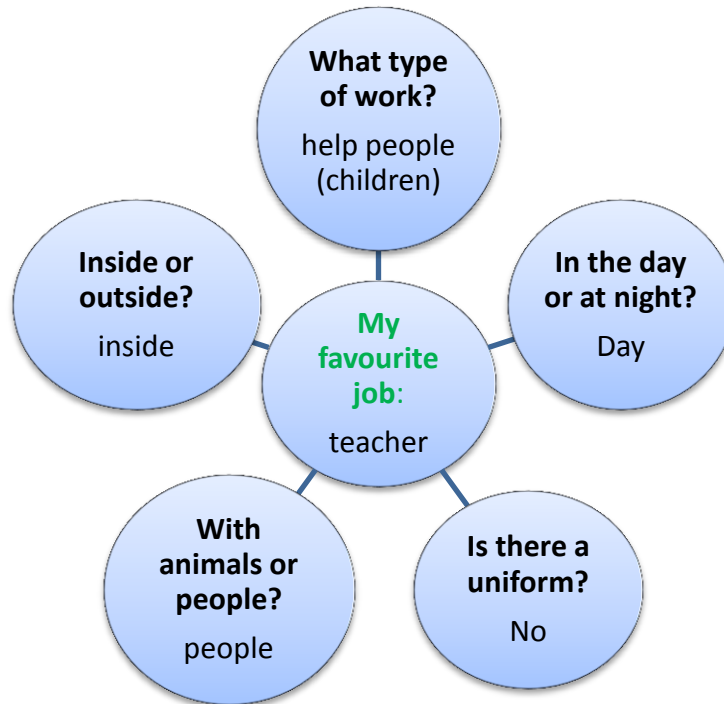
